## What you need to know

The Centre of Excellence for Information Sharing (the Centre) works with local places and central government departments to investigate, challenge and overcome cultural barriers to information sharing to help public sector reform.

This unique position allows the Centre to support public sector organisations at both a local and national level. By listening and working collaboratively, the Centre helps to uncover and understand what is limiting good information sharing, and implement lasting change.

Challenging culture is at the heart of the Centre's work which in turn inspires public service transformation. The Centre are a not-for-profit organisation, funded by central government departments, local authorities and public sector organisations.

The Centre's approach ranges from co-locating with a team, to meeting key people within partnering organisations to understand what challenges they are facing and how these could be overcome. Through case studies, blogs, events, training and guidance, the Centre then captures good practice and shares it to help others overcome similar issues.
